

Summary of the scholarship period

From 12th July to 16th July I did a research scholarship at Corvinus University in Budapest. The tutor of the scholarship was prof. Tunde Tatrai.

I achieved the following aims of the mobility:

- presenting scientific theses of my monograph,
- holding scientific consultations on my scientific theses with prof. Tünde Tátrai,
- conducting additional bibliographical tests after consultations with prof. Tünde Tátrai,.

I presented my current research in the field of the principle of equal treatment in public procurement.

I had scientific meetings with prof. T. Tatrai in aim to present theses of my monograph. Thanks to the consultation, I was able to run an effective bibliographic period at the Corvinus University Library.

During the scholarship I prepared a detailed written study on the following issues:

- the application and standardization of the principle of equal treatment in public procurement;
- justification of axiological principles of equal treatment,
- functions of the principle of equal treatment in public procurement.

I verified my main research thesis. I have confirmed that from the point of view of the issue of public procurements, the impact of fundamental rights on the European legislation is of vital importance. The impact of fundamental rights on the European law may be referred to changes happening in the area of believes or ways of perceiving such law in the international community. Moreover, it may influence an appropriate shaping of the international law interpretation, and finally, undertaking certain law-shaping actions. In case of the European Union, the impact of fundamental rights on the obligations of equal treatment is already expressed, among others, by the fact that the existing legislative system, firstly created based on the parties' consent, binding only in the scope of the made agreements and in order to complete integration plans, evolves towards an integrated legal system with a vital role of fundamental rights and accompanying procedural guarantees. A substantial role in the increase of the meaning of fundamental rights is played by jurisprudence, especially in the area of the court development of the legal principles and understanding the freedom of the internal market, and later, legislative activity.

Currently, I am in constant contact with prof. Tunde Tatrai.

I am very grateful to Tibor Keresztesi from the Tempus Public Foundation for his help during my stay in Budapest. All formalities were organized very well.
